

Call

All mandatory call is home call, covering Truman Medical Center. Moonlighting fellows cover night and weekend call at Saint Luke's Hospital, and most fellows choose to participate in this opportunity. Fellows participate in STEMI cases, direct care for cardiology admissions (performed by in-hospital medicine residents for stable patients, fellows come in to the hospital for unstable patients).

- 1st year – 4 weekday calls per month (only non-service months, no call when assigned to CCU service or Truman service) + 1 in 4 weekend call (typically covering Saint Luke's Hospital)
- 2nd year – 3-4 weekday calls per month (only non-service months) + 1 in 4 weekend call (typically covering Truman Medical Center on the weekend)
- 3rd year – 1 call per month – no weekend call (3rd year fellows typically cover more moonlighting shifts at SLH)

Moonlighting

Fellows are allowed to moonlight at SLH facilities only. The primary moonlighting opportunity is covering cardiology and cardiovascular surgery services overnight and on weekends on the CVIC (Cardiovascular In-Hospital Call service). Most fellows choose to participate in moonlighting, which is also a fantastic educational experience with excellent faculty back-up. Shifts are 13 hours on weeknights (6pm-7am) and 12 or 24 hours on weekend days (7am-7pm, 7pm-7am or 7am-7am). Fellows provide cross coverage, admit patients to the cardiac ICU, perform cardiology consultations and provide stat Echo coverage.
