

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM ASSETS

Extensive exposure to all facets of contemporary cardiology practice with high procedural volumes.

Fellows gain training and exposure to:

- Coronary angiography, left and right heart catheterization, peripheral angiography and intervention, renal artery denervation structural heart intervention including TAVR, ASD/PFO closure, LAA occlusion/ligation, carotid intervention, and deep and superficial venous intervention
- Full range of EP services, including pacemakers, ICDs, CRT, SVT and atrial flutter ablation, atrial fibrillation ablation, ILR implant, consultative EP services
- Full service Echo laboratory including high volume TEE including 3D in intraoperative TEE, transthoracic echo, stress echo and peripheral vascular ultrasound
- High volume nuclear cardiology lab including the latest PET and SPECT myocardial perfusion imaging
- Cardiovascular CT including coronary, structural, and peripheral vascular imaging conducted and read by the cardiology group
- Cardiac MRI, performed and read by the cardiology group
- Advanced Heart Failure and Transplant services, with a high volume cardiac transplant practice (SLH ranks in the top 10 in the country in cardiac transplant volume each of the last several years) and advanced mechanical circulatory support with an active LVAD program

Abundant subspecialty fellowship opportunities after general cardiology, including Interventional Cardiology, Clinical Cardiac Electrophysiology, Advanced Heart Failure/Transplant, Cardiovascular Outcomes Research and Advanced Nuclear/Imaging Cardiology fellowships

Meal Allowance at both Saint Luke's Hospital and Truman Medical Center.

Time Off – 16 days of vacation per contract year, 12 days of sick per year, and 5 days of conference leave per contract year. Vacation and conference time does not carry over from year to year.

Educational Monies - \$1000.00 per contract year for meeting/educational materials.

Presentation Funding - \$500.00 for presenting at a national meeting.
- Must be applied for in advance of the meeting.

ACLS and BLS training and recertification throughout fellowship, paid for by the program.

Uniform Allowance – 2 Monogrammed white coats to start first year of fellowship, funds for 1 white coat each of the following years.

Licensure – MO Temporary License and BNDD fees paid by UMKC each year. Permanent Training License fees are not paid by UMKC and are required for fellows who choose to participate in moonlighting at SLH.

Parking – Free covered and badge accessed parking at SLH and TMC.

Some textbooks provided by the fellowship program as well as a fellowship library.

Ipads and laptop computers to check out for use in research, rounding, etc.

In-Training Exam – annual exam for all fellows.

Major Medical, Dental, and Vision for self and dependents – shared cost with UMKC.

Basic Group Life and Disability Insurance paid by UMKC.

Personal and Professional Development Program – provided by SLH. Programs include, among others; educational debt management, contracting for employment, art and medicine.

Physicians Wives donation of tickets to events around the city, KC Royals, Chiefs, Sporting KC, Starlight Theater, Ballet and other social gatherings
