Objective:

- Complete the below IHI online modules on line with a score of 75% or better. Print out certificates of completion, that you have done this on your CV and place in your portfolio for review at your biannual evaluation.
- Read the American Board of Radiology Core Quality and Safety Study Guide dated 4/30/14

Instructions for IHI website:

1. Go to the IHI open school website at: <http://www.ihl.org/education/ihlopenschool/>
2. Link can also found on UMKC radiology website under “resources”, “helpful links”, “educational websites”
3. Create a username and password. Keep track of this for the future.
4. Log in
5. Under “Courses and certificates” click the “click here to get started” button.
6. Click “IHI open school academic” which will take you to a welcome page
7. Click the “click here to browse the courses and get started” button.
8. Complete these courses using the free UMKC subscription:
 - PS 100 - Introduction to patient safety
 - PS 101 – Fundamentals of patient safety
 - QI 101 - Fundamentals of Improvement
 - QI 102 – The model for Improvement, your engine for change
9. Complete the course evaluation and print certificate for “Physician CME”
10. Put Certificate in your portfolio
